I appreciate especially your long term commitment to the work of the Mission here at Kakata in Liberia, and to my apostolate.

The painters are doing their work and the masons are also doing the last bits of their stuff, fixing glass plates and other things. I will hope to send you the pictures of the dedication when that has been done.

One idea that we have for the future is to build a retreat house that can help to heal many wounds that Colombian people have because of the violence that we have suffered throughout our history.

Thanks so much for your help and God bless your life and your work. We serve in different area of the human life, trying to give a comprehensive formation to people the Lord puts in our path and providing an opportunity for our religious to serve the people of God. At the moment we have 17 seminarians, 9 that are postulants and eight religious with temporary vows. Six priests, four working in parishes and two working in formation. During the school year seminarians work in different ministries: parish catechesis, with special children, in a nursing home, with children of women who have worked in prostitution, youth groups and church groups. Twice a year we travel to remote and forgotten regions of Colombia to do missions. In times of Christmas and Easter.
